Re: EO 14248 and the DOJ Voting Section letter of 6/25/25 to the Nevada Secretary of State

Dear Ms. Bondi, Ms. Riordan, and Mr. Graves,

I write today on behalf of the grassroots Washoe Election Integrity Team and myself, a longtime resident of Reno, Nevada, in support of you in your investigations to bring transparency to elections and to hold our Secretary of State accountable. We need your inspection and welcome it for the issues in Nevada are complex and myriad and far beyond the means of citizens such as us to expose and obtain meaningful change.

As such, we respectfully request a formal federal investigation of Nevada's and Washoe County's election systems and practices under the authority of Executive Order 14248: Preserving and Protecting the Integrity of American Elections, issued on March 25, 2025.

Based on our findings, the evidence that implicates election systems and officials in Nevada and Washoe County is substantive in volume and in veracity. Nevada laws and practices do not comply with EO 14248, numerous federal laws, and even Nevada's own Voters Bill of Rights. I will spare you the details, knowing there're details behind each and every point I make below:

- Encoded vote tabulation, QR and bar codes, not human auditable.

- Ballots accepted and counted or cured after election day in contradiction to 2 USC § 7 and 3 USC § 1.
- Automated signature verification, Runbeck (Clark County), Blue Crest (Washoe County), unregulated.
- Foreign-related systems/components: Konnech (Poll Books), Bpro-Knowink, Scytl, hardware.
- Unclean voter rolls, manipulation during elections, ERIC and VREMS data sharing without the voter's consent, stale data, old data.
- Self-affirmation of citizenship.
- Multiple voter ID numbers.
- Voter registrations and/or signatures canceled or altered without knowledge or consent, caused by automatic voter registration, and migration to the new Voter Registration and Election Management Solution (VREMS) in violation of 52 USC § 20507.
- Records and reporting violation caused by cast vote records not matching the Election Administration Valuation Survey v.1 for the 2024 general election.
- Deprivation of a voter's right to a paper ballot at the polls pursuant to Nevada Constitution art. 2 § 1A (10) and Nevada Revised Statute 293.2546 (10)—Voters Bill of Rights.
- Presumption of guilt if a mail ballot recipient goes to the polls to vote and does not relinquish their mail ballot. The presumption of guilt is rooted in law that requires the mail ballot voter to give an attestation of their innocence that they did not cast

their mail ballot before voting in-person, upon penalty of perjury. The affirmation itself is a form of literacy test, prohibited by the Civil Rights Act and Voting Rights Act, as is also a presumption of guilt. See also Nevada Constitution art 2 § 4, “During the day on which any General Election shall be held in this State no qualified elector shall be arrested by virtue of any civil process.”

- Vote centers are less secure than precinct voting for Continuity of Operations Plans and they obfuscate results by precinct, causing extra time and expense to resort all ballots by precinct compared to simply voting in one’s own precinct.
- Vote centers are discriminatory to the poor, sick, and elderly who have to travel farther than needed compared to precinct voting. Fewer numbers of voting locations create less access and less human assistance as required by ADA and VAEHA.
- Dilution of the integrity and security of the EASE federal Internet voter registration and voting portal by a) giving native American Indians full access, and b) allowing anyone to self-affirm a disability to use the system without any oversight of eligibility to claim disability. A headache is all that’s needed, if that.
- Threats and intimidation/extortion of the republican Washoe County commissioners by the Secretary of State, in collusion with former Washoe County CDDA Ms. Kandaras (counsel to the Board of Commissioners), to influence their vote to immediately certify a recount of a local election in the 2024 primary in Washoe County. See *Aguilar v. Commissioners Andriola, Clark, and Herman*, Nevada Supreme Court, Case No. 88965.¹
- The Secretary of State then embedded his people into Washoe County in the 2024 general election in violation of 18 USC 595.

- Deprivation of County's enumerated right to regulate and conduct local elections, and designate the places of elections, pursuant to Nevada Constitution art. 4 § 20.

Based on these concerns, I respectfully request that you and your office initiate an investigation into Washoe County's Office of Registrar of Voters and the Nevada Secretary of State, with attention given to:

1. Whether all voting, processing, tabulating, reporting equipment, and data storage and retrieval systems in Nevada comply with the standards in EO 14248, including the ban on encoding vote counting and cybersecurity.
2. Whether voter verification systems and procedures comply with the standards in EO 14248, including automated signature verification and cybersecurity.
3. Whether proof-of-citizenship requirements are being enforced during registration and maintained through proper list oversight.
4. Whether foreign components or software are embedded in the systems used for voter registration, voter check-in, vote casting, vote tabulation, or reporting.
5. Whether Nevada's election mail materials expose a voter's signature in violation of the federal Identity Theft and Assumption Deterrence Act.
6. Whether cast vote records and voter roll data is altered post-election and reported as accurate and true.
7. Whether the Secretary of State threatened and intimidated Washoe commissioners in and/or interfered in elections in Washoe in 2024, abusing his authority.
8. Whether Washoe County or Nevada has discriminated against any voter.

9. Whether Washoe County or Nevada has violated voter's rights per the U.S. and Nevada Constitutions.
10. Whether Nevada's statewide election practices meet the funding eligibility standards established by the Election Assistance Commission in accordance with EO 14248, the Help America Vote Act, Identity Theft and Assumption Deterrence Act, Civil Rights Act, and the Voting Rights Act.

Nevada ranks lowest of the low in election integrity, to which Washoe County may be the worst. The president's executive order rightly declares that "elections must be honest and worthy of the public trust." My team and I fully support this directive and believe that states like Nevada and counties such as Washoe must be held accountable to it.

Please, consider this letter a formal request for a federal investigation of Washoe County's and Nevada's election systems and procedures. My team and I am prepared to provide you with evidence to support the above issues if requested. Attached is a citizens' complaint filed with Washoe County earlier this year. It may be helpful in your Nevada investigations because it gives context to what's happening in the back rooms of elections in Nevada, under the oversight of the Secretary of State. I hope this information is of interest.

Thank you to the Department of Justice and President Trump for giving Nevada's elections the attention it needs and to strive to make them fair, honest, transparent, and trustworthy. If there's anything I or my associates can do to help, please don't hesitate to ask.
